To the Honorable the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The Memorial of the undersigned Members of Committee of the Launceston and Deloraine Railway, appointed by a Public Meeting of Colonists, held in Launceston at 12 o'clock noon of the 27th day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and others, Landholders in the Northern District of the Island.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

THAT Memorialists have read the amended Resolutions submitted to the Honorable the House of Assembly by the Honorable Member for Campbell Town.

That Memorialists re-assert the justice of the claim upon the Government unanimously expressed in the Resolutions of the Public Meeting aforesaid, that, as the proposed Railway would pass over and near a considerable breadth of public land, the Local Government should construct the same.

That, from the year 1858 to the present time, the Government and Parliament of the country have encouraged the people to believe that expenditure of time and money in making the necessary preliminary enquiries would lead to a satisfactory settlement of this important question.

That the case in favour of the construction of the said Railway having now been fully made out, your Memorialists observe with great anxiety that a disposition exists in high quarters still to delay the measures necessary to secure the construction of this work.

That Memorialists believe that, unless some favourable decision is come to before the present Session of Parliament terminates, very many small landowners and others will abandon the Colony.

That under these circumstances, and under these circumstances alone, in order that the people may secure a legal authority for the full expression of their views on a question of such vital interest to their very existence as an Agricultural Community, and for the purpose of allaying the agitation of the public mind, and of avoiding any further delay and expense, Memorialists are prepared to recommend to the sanction of your Honorable House the Resolutions of the Honorable Member for Campbell Town.

Memorialists therefore pray that, with a view to the settlement of this question, your Honorable House will sanction the said Resolutions.

And, in duty bound, they will ever pray, &c.
