# • Inquiry into the Tasmanian Government's process into the feasibility planning for a new sporting and event stadium in Hobart

The Parliamentary Standing Committee of Public Accounts has received 926 public submissions from individuals, organisations and the Tasmanian Government to its inquiry into the Tasmanian Government's process into the feasibility planning for a new sporting and event stadium in Hobart (submissions closed 16 February 2023). Whilst not the highest number of submissions to be received by a Parliamentary Committee inquiry<sup>1</sup>, the number of submissions received indicates the Tasmanian Community holds a high level of interest in the Tasmanian Government's planning of the proposed stadium and where it might be sited in Hobart.

Whilst not a specific focus of the Public Accounts Committee Inquiry into this matter, a significant number of submissions also questioned the need for a new stadium. Submissions are available on the public website: see
