

Electric Telegraph Department, Hobart, 16th July, 1883.

I HAVE the honor to furnish the usual annual Telegraph Returns for the year ending 31st December, 1882.

The following abstract of results will be found very satisfactory as compared with the previous year :—

During the year a new line has been constructed from Launceston, *via* Lefroy and Bridport, to Gladstone and Moorina, with a branch from Bridport through Scottsdale to Branhholm and Upper Ringarooma, consisting of 120 miles of new line, and opening seven new stations. In connection with this a second wire has been run from Lefroy to Low Head, thus giving direct communication between Launceston and Low Head, with an alternative line available in case of accident or press of business.

Since the 31st December a portion of the West Coast line has also been completed, from Waratah to Corinna, and an office was opened at the latter place on the 10th July. The line Outlands to Tunnack has also been completed, and offices opened on the 11th July at Parattah and Tunnack.

An extension of the line from Gould's Country to Moorina is also in progress, and will, when completed, place the North-eastern District in direct communication with George's Bay, and thus unite the Fingal line with the Bridport and Gladstone line at Moorina.

During the year the main lines from Hobart to Low Head have had considerable attention, and are in good order, the section Launceston to Low Head being in fact almost a new line. The interruptions on these lines have been few and of short duration.

The North-west Coast line from Deloraine to Wynyard has also had considerable repairs and alterations effected, tending to place it in a more satisfactory working condition. This is shown by the fact that interruptions are not now of so frequent occurrence, and are speedily removed.

The section from Wynyard to Stanley is not so satisfactory; but I trust before the winter sets in to see my recommendations as to this section carried out, when the North-west Coast line should give considerably more satisfaction than it has hitherto done.

The Fingal and East Coast lines are in very fair order, considerable improvements having been effected in both under the contracts for maintenance.

The Huon line is not satisfactory, nor do I think it will be possible to make it so unless the recommendations made by me in my Report of the 2nd April, 1883, are carried out. I trust this will be done as early as possible in order to give reliability of communication to an important district.

The line from Hobart through New Norfolk to Hamilton and the Ouse has lately been put in thorough order; the Longford, Carrick, and Bishopsbourne section is also satisfactory.

The Submarine Cable between Tasmania and Victoria has worked uninterruptedly during the year; the working of the Low Head Repeating Station by the Cable Staff continues to give satisfaction; and generally the Officers of the Telegraph Department have carried out their duties efficiently and well.

Telephonic communication is gradually coming into favour, and the instruments used (the Edison-Bell) give general satisfaction. As a rapid and easy means of communication it cannot well be surpassed, and I think it is one that might be taken advantage of to place outlying districts in communication with the telegraphic system, at a small annual cost for working and maintenance.

The Telephone Exchange in Hobart will shortly be in working order; but the public do not seem over anxious to avail themselves of its facilities, as but few applications for attachment have been received.

The instruments, batteries, &c. at the various offices are generally in good order; but I find that the rapid increase in the business of the Telegraph Department, the extension of lines, and opening of new offices, renders it impossible that I can be absent from head quarters sufficiently long to visit and thoroughly inspect the whole of the offices under my charge. It will become necessary therefore, in order to maintain good discipline and ensure satisfactory management of each Station, that a competent officer be appointed whose duty it shall be to visit all offices, and so keep them up to a proper standard of efficiency.

I cannot say that the keeping open till midnight of the Hobart and Launceston offices has been taken advantage of by the public to the extent that might have been expected; but I am unable to recommend a return to the previous system of overtime, as the use now made of the wire by the Press would soon result in a much larger expenditure than that at present necessary.

In order to bring about a reduction in the charges on Intercolonial Telegrams, the Tasmanian and Victorian Governments guaranteed a subsidy at the rate of £1200 per annum to meet any probable deficiency in the Submarine Cable Receipts, and to protect the Company against loss, but the experience of the first twelve months was so favourable that the guarantee ceased on the 31st December, 1882, the Government foregoing any claim to repayment on account of that year.

That such reduction, which came into operation on the 1st January, 1882, proved a success financially, as well as being appreciated by the public, is shown by the fact that there was an increase of about 26 per cent. in the gross receipts, and 122 per cent. in the number of messages transmitted, as compared with the previous year.

In any case extra Staff will be necessary both at Hobart and Launceston before long, as during the last summer (the busiest season) the work was very heavy, and often more than the Officers could satisfactorily get through.

Considerable alterations and additions have been made to the Hobart Office, by which the accommodation for the public has been much improved, and better internal arrangements and comfort for the Officers employed provided.
