

ESTABLISHMENT AT THE CASCADES.

REPORT FOR 1875.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Crowther, and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 12, 1876.



Superintendent's Office, Cascades, 23rd May, 1876.

I HAVE the honor to forward herewith Returns Nos. 1 and 2, showing the cost of maintenance of Women and Children, Male Prisoners, Juvenile Offenders, and Male Invalids for the year ended 31st December, 1875.

FEMALE HOUSE OF CORRECTION.

A. The net cost per head of Women in the Female House of Correction was £24 ls. or £6 14s. 4d. more than for the year 1874,—consequent on reduced numbers and value of stores received but not expended.

B. The net cost per head of Children was £12 7s. $3\frac{3}{4}d$.

MALE GAOL.

C. On the 4th August, 26 Men under sentence were transferred from the Gaol in Campbellstreet. The effectives and light labour men have been principally employed on the farm in raising vegetables in aid of rations, green fodder for cattle, &c. The net cost per head was £18 11s. 8\frac{1}{4}d. for the five months ending 31st December, 1875.

TRAINING SCHOOL FOR JUVENILE OFFENDERS.

- The net cost per head of Juvenile Offenders was £9 12s. 63d.
- The net cost per head for Male Invalids was £12 7s. $3\frac{2}{4}d$.
