- 1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.
- 2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.
- 3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.
- 4 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.
- 5 PETITION. - Ms Dow presented a Petition from approximately 814 citizens of Tasmania, requesting that the House request the Government to reinstate public bus services between Strahan, Queenstown and Hobart (HA1/2019).

Which Petition was read and received.
