I am making a submission to the Select Committee as Vice President of Friends of the Waratah Reservoir Incorporated.

It relates to terms of reference 9.

In brief, Taswaters actions and proposed actions in relation to the Waratah water supply by decommissioning the Waratah Reservoir dam wall has to date and will into the future:

-create a risk to tourism infrastructure and loss of tourism and economic growth potential.

-exponentially increase the community's exposure to fire risk.

-increase the community's risk to safety and infrastructure damage from flash flooding.

-require the community to be on water restrictions in dry times where no risk now exists.
