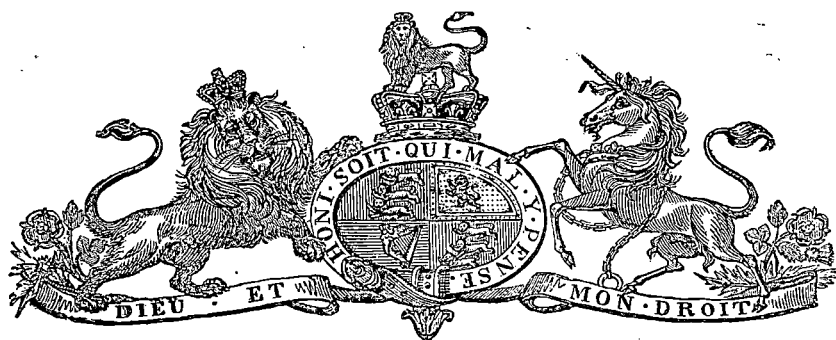

CARRY INTO EFFECT THE VOTE OF £500 FOR THE INTRODUCTION
OF SALMON.

Presented by Mr. Innes, and ordered by the House to be printed, 1 April, 1857.



The SELECT COMMITTEE of the House of Assembly appointed on the 26th March, 1857, "to devise means to carry into effect the Vote of £500 passed by this House for the Introduction of SALMON," have agreed to the following

R E P O R T.

YOUR Committee, having deliberated upon the matter referred for their consideration, beg leave to recommend that the Honourable the Colonial Secretary be requested to communicate with Messieurs Ducroz, Dunn, and Youl in London, authorising the expenditure on their part of a sum of £20 in making known that a reward of £500 will be paid by the Government of Tasmania to the first person who shall successfully introduce live Salmon into the Colony, and requesting their adoption of such means as they may consider calculated to further the object in question.
