

The duties of Coroner have been performed either in the morning before the Police Office opened or after all the work required to be done in it by the Stipendiary Magistrate had terminated, and have frequently extended to a late hour at night.

RETURN of the Routine Duties of the Stipendiary Magistrate of Hobart Town.

Taking all Charges, Informations, and Complaints, and granting Summonses and Warrants thereon.

Adjudicating in all cases brought before the Bench at Hobart Town for trial or examination, except on Mondays.

Signing Warrants daily of all offenders sentenced there, except on Mondays.

Taking Recognizances and Affidavits.

Stating Cases for opinion of Judges.

Carrying on the Correspondence of the Office, reporting on Petitions, and answering all Memos. called for by Government.

Examining Accounts of Fees and Fines, for which he is held responsible.

Going to Hospital, when necessary, to take examinations in cases of Insane patients, and signing Orders for their removal to Asylum at New Norfolk.

Holding a Court weekly for consideration of Claims to admission of destitute Children into Asylum at New Town.

Attending at both Houses of Correction to try Prisoners charged with offences therein, which duty has to be done at hours which do not interfere with the regular work in the Police Office.

Visiting Kingston once a week to try offenders, and inspect Accounts and Returns in the Police Office there.

Holding a Court of Requests there once a Month for £10 cases, and once a Quarter for £30 cases.

Preparing Electoral Rolls for the three Electoral Districts of Buckingham, Glenorchy, and Queenborough; and performing all other duties appertaining to office of Returning Officer.
