- 1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.
- 2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.
- 3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.
- 4 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.
- 5 PETITION. – Dr *Broad* presented a Petition from approximately 439 citizens of Tasmania, requesting that the House call on the Minister for Primary Industries and Water to keep the local North West meat industry sustainable by supporting the establishment of a new community sale yard in the North West. (HA6/2020).
