R.S.H. Repulsions massacres, Count Sternberg "My Experiences of the Boer War" Longman, 1900.

Count Sternberg is an author, soldier and served there in the rank of 1st Lieut & Major in the fighting. He first offered his services to the Brit. Govt. and when declined, offered them to the Boers, with the like result. He then went as a spectator.

Both of the Boer leaders believe they are fighting by their standard, corruption & their ill breeding, and their general laziness.

The Emperor's telegram. It "fell like a bomb spreading terror among those who opposed reform... The Germans had to stand for that telegram. They were dismasted from their situation, all relations with them were broken off, and they saw their incomes disappearing."

"It looks as if the French will declare war if independent. That will enable Eng. with all justice, to declare war."

"It is a little to me how these Great Powers of arms & ammunition, wh. came to a great extent from Eng. itself, and from well known factories, could be supplied, and carried on Eng. ships, without attracting attention of the Eng. authorities. Three millions were spent on boats, & every preparation made for war. It is said that the Eng. Commander in Chief in S.A. sent exhaustive reports to his Govt. No question arises as to what steps might have been taken at that time by the Eng. Govt., and whether thereby sufficient bloodshed might not have been avoided."

"There can be no doubt that Eng. was long suffering; and that, as far as this war is concerned, she was justified in the eyes of God and man."

The Gold fields, he says, "are quite unsuited for continental war". Apart from that, the Boer Govt. had reached the zenith of incapacity; in respect it was the worst Govt. in the world and I am an Austrian, say it. "Corruption unknown in Prussia or nowhere else in the world."

"I sat down with 'British' to read the European newspaper report of the war & was astounded to find so many untrue & erroneous impressions contained in them. This was first by representing the solution of the business as quite easy, & later by holding the Eng. army to blame for their own failure to appreciate the situation correctly."

"No continental army would have done better than the Eng. with the same or even somewhat greater numbers, and I personally doubt if, as regards fresh equipment, technical smartness and leadership, a cont'd. army would have done so well."

"In S.A. they repaired railways that were damaged in less time than the Boers had taken to damage them."

He pays a high compliment to the Chivalry & Kindness of the Eng. army, p. 209.

The Small Industries of France.

From an article by Ernest Gosselin in The Const. Rev. for Sept. 1904.

The "solid & enduring prosperity" of the French people here spoken of "is solely to be attributed to the laws of France wh. despite protectionist duties, wh. have killed far more industries than they have fostered, have kept the producer rather than the consumer by promoting and encouraging the division of landed property."

In some parts the small industries languish from want of co-operation and the best machinery. In others, the people avail themselves of water power, wherever it is there is a waterfall, of gas, electricity. The small land owners utilize their spare time in various industries and make a very considerable addition to their incomes.

Some of these industries are - at St. Etienne, silk ribbon weaving - 16,000 looms worked by peasant barbers - only 5,000 in the manuf. also each of his neighborhood of 7,000, 600 weavers. Turrian men's ties. surgical dressings.

Round Amiens, stuff for umbrellas & for ladies' shoes, and the shoes themselves. Earnings for the latter alone some 10 mil. francs annually.

St. Quentin & Bohain. Shawls and the like.

Cotentin Combray, Cambrai, Solesmes & Caen dry curtain and tables.

Chalet - hooked handkerchiefs. Some 10,000 workers employed. This industry has suffered from protectionist duties.

Rouen Falaise, in Normandy. Cotton hosiery. 12,000 to 15,000 employed. Earnings 3½ to 4 f. a day. Women 10,000. 2½ to 3 f. whole of Normandy filled with weavers. The high duties have protected, not the workers, but the factory-owners. Made the latter unprogressive, injuring the whole weaving industry of Normandy.

Rouen Sedan some 3,500 weavers, each owning his own house & field & earning 2 to 2 f. p.d. by weaving.

Vicinity of Romorantin, Argenton, & Chateauroux, South of Orleans, market gardening & wine-growing, women sewing, and embroidery handkerchiefs, ladies' linen collars, cuffs, &c.

Orléans, round Nancy & Mirecourt. Hand-embroidery-flowers, leaves, birds, human figures, each doing only one line.

Nancy. Straw hats. Mirecourt, strings & instruments. The smaller parts bridge, screws &c.

Round Roanne, fancy knitting. More than 20,000 women aggregate earnings from this industry alone 8 f. more than 9 m. f. p.a.

at Brétigny spurs, bridles, ch. 5 mil. Each at one article.

Tinchebray in Normandy, very clever wh. & metal work, some veritable works of art - Comb & other articles of horn & mother of pearl.

Guéret in N.W. of Limousin, great centre for ironmongery. By specializing the people compete successfully with the manufacturers. in many articles. In some places handlooms, in another, screws; in others, Ray's, Soles, &c.

Round Sedan & Charleville making bolts & nuts. They co-operate closely, near Charleville, cutlery, hardware, Scissors, & surgical instruments of finest finish & highest quality.

Thiers. Making buttons from the refuse of horse and bone & from the Ridge handles - also stay-fronts. They use water & gas power - a division of labor.

In Chambon, files, holly, Skewes, hammer, maul, &c. to the value of 15 m. f. p.a.

In some places in Normandy Combines are made, the cutting's used for buttons. Earnings 4 to 5 f. p.d.

Beaune air, N. of Paris brush making - 15,000 employed. One manuf. employs over 3,000 workers, partly in the villages, output over 5 m. f. p.a.

Montreuil, about 2,500 people working boots, shoes - nearly as many in making hair, tooth and nail brushes.

Reville a village, all sorts of things, from bone, horn, ivory or mother of pearl. Same at Merle, also faience.

Auderville esp. noted for faience in ivory and mother of pearl. also leather mother of pearl buttons.

Montfontaine & St. Genevieve, wooden boxes on large scale - Fair industry est'd. to be worth 10 m. f. p.a. to France.

Bayonet making in various places, and growth of the willows. Great use of wood. Some heath 8c. - wooden shoes - 600,000 pairs p.a. at Jupilles

Alençon, umbrella handles.

Rouen village of les Coutures, wired in trunks.

St. Cloud, menu deons - pipes, more than 4,000 employed.

Montmorency - Chairs - made in the cottages -

Villedieu le Poer, more than 400 coppermiths -

From Plougasnel in Brittany, strawberries, shipped to Paris p.a. to the value of 4 m. f.
