

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT of the Inspector of Police on the State of the Territorial Police of Tasmania, for the Year ending 31st December, 1881.

Office of Inspector of Police, 4th June, 1882.

STR

I BEG to submit the Report on the state of the Territorial Police for the year 1881. The first six months had been reported upon; but I have repeated it, that the completed year may be given.

The Reports will for the future be made on each year, in compliance with the custom prevailing in other Departments.

I have great satisfaction in recording that the general conduct of the Police Force during the year has been excellent.

The improved prospects offered by recent legislation have been duly appreciated; and the effect must be beneficial to the permanency and efficiency of the Force.

The existing strength of the Police was found sufficient for the demands upon it, although there was considerable movement in mining affairs during the period reported upon.

Offences of all kinds have diminished in frequency during the past year. The most remarkable decrease is in the cases of drunkenness, as shown by the subjoined Table.

#### HOBART.

The Chief District Constable is Collector of Fees due to Charitable Institutions, Town Surveyor, Bailiff of Crown Lands, Sub-Collector of Carriage Duties, Collector of Rural Police Rates for the District of Hobart, Collector of Fees due to Training School, and Inspector under the Contagious Diseases Act. A District Constable is Summoning Officer to the Supreme Court (Criminal), and a Constable performs the duties of Coroner's Clerk. Two Constables of this Force are exclusively employed guarding the Powder Magazine, one during the day and the other during the night, two others are engaged on the wharves in connection with the Customs, one in the Domain, and another in the Domain and Chief District Constable's Office.

## EMU BAY AND RUSSELL.

There was only one resignation in this Force during the year.

The Chief District Constable holds the offices of Tidewaiter of Customs, Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Acting Police Clerk, Bailiff of Crown Lands, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, Collector of Police Rates, Collector of Carriage Duty. A District Constable is Bailiff of Crown Lands and Mining Registrar; two others are Tidewaiters of Customs and Registrars of the Courts of Requests. An Acting District Constable is also Tidewaiter and Harbour Master, while one is Registrar and another Bailiff of the Court of Requests. A Constable is also a Tidewaiter.

Three publicans were convicted of breaches of the Licensing Act.

A Sergeant acts as Police Clerk, Registrar of the Court of Requests, Collector of Police Rates, Sub-Collector of Carriage Duty, and Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages.

A Constable acts as Police Clerk and Registrar of the Court of Requests. A Constable is Bailiff of the Court of Requests.

The promise of a large gold seeking population at Mount Cameron has not been fulfilled. No unnecessary buildings, however, were recommended.

This Force has been increased by one Constable. One Constable had resigned.

The Chief District Constable is Crown Bailiff, Collector of Police Rates, and Inspector of Stock. Two District Constables and an Acting District Constable are Bailiffs of the Court of Requests.

The Chief District Constable is Bailiff of Crown Lands, Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. The District Constable is Bailiff of Crown Lands and of the Court of Requests, and Clearing Officer of Customs. The Acting District Constable, who performs the duties of Police Clerk at Kingston, is Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, and Registrar of the Court of Requests.

## SOUTH LONGFORD.

Losses of sheep have been reported from this District, attributed in some instances by the owners to theft. No detection has followed. The chief use of the South Longford Force is for the protection of stock.

I trust that this Force is preventive in its action. Results do not show that it is detective.

#### TASMAN'S PENINSULA.

The settlement upon the agricultural land is steadily increasing. A District Constable is stationed at Port Arthur, and a Constable at Salt Water River.

## PIEMAN RIVER.

The Force stationed in this District would seem out of proportion to the number of inhabitants; but the mines are distant from each other, and public interests with respect to Customs and timber have to be guarded by the Police, who save the expense of Officers specially provided by other Departments. Wherever public-houses are licensed the neighbouring inhabitants demand Police protection.

b The Chief District Constable and the District Constable have £25 a year forage allowance. An Acting District Constable receives £25 for performing the duties of Police Clerk at Kingston. The Chief District Constable and one Constable have £10 a year each travelling allowance. With the exception of the Chief District Constable and an Acting District Constable, the Force have quarters.

c The Chief District Constable and one District Constable receive forage allowance, the former £40 and the latter £25 per annum, and one District Constable receives £25 travelling allowance. The Sergeant receives £35 per annum for performing the duties of Police Clerk at Franklin. The District Constables, the Sergeant, and five Constables have quarters.

d The Chief District Constable receives £25 per annum for forage, and £25 travelling allowance. One District Constable and three Constables £25 per annum forage allowance, and two Constables, one £10 and the other £20, for travelling allowance. With the exception of the Chief District Constable, all the Force have quarters.

e The Chief District Constable receives £30 forage, and a District Constable £25 and two Constables £10 per annum for travelling allowances, and one Constable £25 forage allowance. With the exception of a Constable, the Force have quarters.

f The Chief District Constable receives £50 forage allowance, and the two District Constables £25 each travelling allowance. With the exception of a District Constable and two Constables, the Force have quarters.
