1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.

2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.

3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.

4 LEAVE TO MAKE MOTION WITHOUT NOTICE. - *Ordered*, That the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport have leave to make a Motion without Notice. (The Minister for Infrastructure and Transport)

5 SESSIONAL ORDERS. – A Motion being made and the Question being proposed – That for the remainder of this Session:

- (1) Standing Order 18, paragraph (*a*) be amended by leaving out "be at Six o'clock p.m." and insert instead "be no later than 5.25 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays; and 2:30 p.m. on Wednesdays".
- (2) Standing Order 119 be amended by leaving out "in the Member's place".
- (3) Standing Order 76 be suspended. (The Minister for Infrastructure and Transport)

- 8 BILL NO. 8. The Minister for Infrastructure and Transport presented -

"A Bill for an Act to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Act 1999, the Motor Vehicle Traders Act 2011 and the Taxi and Hire Vehicle Industries Act 2008 and various regulations".
