## THURSDAY, 7 MAY 2020

1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.

**2** ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.

**3** PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.

**4** QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.

5 PAPERS. – The Premier laid upon the Table of the House the following Paper:-

Tasmanian Government COVID-19 Response: Tasmanian Social and Economic Support Measures Update – As at 30 April 2020.

**6** PAPERS. – The Minister for Primary Industries and Water laid upon the Table of the House the following Paper:-

Irrigation Clauses Act 1973: Winnaleah Irrigation District By-Laws 2019.
