Further to my submission i sent you all on May 25 2013 I completely over looked the Reg Kilby, Tasmanian Aboriginal Family. Mr Kilby is a very well respected Aboriginal Elder in the Circular Head Community, and was one of the people who was judged as an Aborigine by the Federal Administrative Tribunal (AAT) in 2002 along with the other Aborigines of which I referred to in my first Submission to you. Uncle Reg Kilby's Aboriginal ancestry came from the North West Coastal area of Tasmania as was recognised by the above (AAT) Hearings, and the Kilby family has always lived, hunted and gathered, and practiced their cultural activities in the above area since European settlement.

They have always maintained a continual connection with the above land, which has never been broken. When Uncle Reg came home from the war he set out with his family to build a shack at West Point, which is one of his ancestral lands. Together they built their beloved shack of which the Kilby family still use to this very day to get together for their cultural hunting and gathering. Their shack is now recognised as a sacred sight by the people of Circular Head because Uncle Reg's late wife Tippy's ashes are scattered at that sight. To the best of my knowledge the Kilby family are the only Aboriginal family in Tasmania that have always lived, hunted, gathered and practiced their culture on the lands of their Tribal Aboriginal Ancestors.
