New Clause A [Non-application of Act] brought up (Ms Webb) and read the First time as follows:----

A. Non-application of Act

- (1) This Act does not apply in respect of development on an actively mobile landform that has not substantially commenced, as determined under the *Land Use Planning and Approvals Act 1993*, before the end of the validation period.
- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1), any work or activity carried out in relation to a development before a LUPA permit is first issued, or purportedly issued, in respect of the development is not to be taken into account when determining whether development has substantially commenced.

Question put, that New Clause A be read a Second time.
